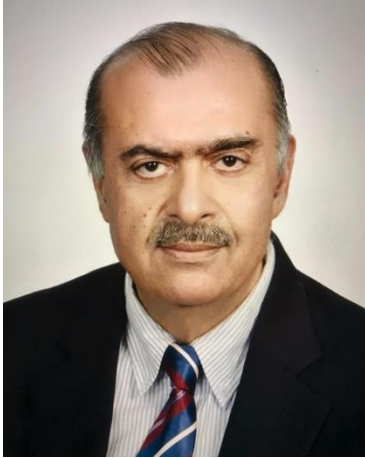

DEFINITIONS

1. **“Admitting University”** means the University of Health Sciences (UHS) Lahore which has been entrusted with the responsibility to conduct a centralized Medical & Dental College Admission Test (MDCAT) and make admissions in all public and private sector medical and dental colleges in Punjab vide Government of Punjab Notification No. SO(ME-II)2-1/2025, dated 22nd October, 2025.
2. **“Application”** means the online application submitted by an eligible candidate for admission to MBBS or BDS course in public sector medical or dental institution of Punjab. An application shall be considered complete only if it is correctly and completely filled, properly submitted as per laid down procedure with all mandatory documents/certificates as prescribed in this Prospectus.
3. **“Chairman Provincial Admission Committee”** means the Secretary, Specialized Healthcare and Medical Education Department, Government of Punjab.
4. **“Dental College”** means an institution offering a course leading to the award of BDS degree on successful completion of all requirements.
5. **“Domicile”** means a certificate of permanent residence issued by the office of Deputy Commissioner under the Pakistan Citizenship Act, 1951 (II of 1951) and rules made there under (vide Rule 23).
6. **“Foreign Student”** means a foreign national or expatriate who has renounced his Pakistani citizenship by submitting a declaration on Form “X” under Section 14-A of the Pakistan Citizenship Act, 1951.
7. **“Overseas Pakistani Student”** means a student who holds foreign nationality or is an Overseas Pakistani (being a Pakistani citizen permanently resident in a foreign country), Green Card Holder, Iqama Holder, Maple Card Holder and who has studied and passed HSSC 12th grade examination or equivalent from within or outside Pakistan accompanied by an equivalence certificate issued by IBCC.
8. **“Government”** means Government of the Punjab.
9. **“Medical College”** means an institution offering a course leading to the award of MBBS degree on successful completion of all requirements.
10. **“Order of Preference”** means the preference order of the colleges given by an applicant in his/her application.

11. **“Provincial Admission Committee”** means a Committee comprising the Vice Chancellors of all public sector Medical Universities in Punjab who shall vet the selections list(s) before public display. The Secretary SHC&ME Department shall be the Chairman of the said Committee.
12. **“Up-gradation”** means the act or process of raising a candidate on merit from an institution he/she was admitted in preceding list to an institution listed higher in the order of preference in his/her application in the subsequent list(s), in the event of creation of vacant seat(s), in subsequent round(s) during the admission process.
13. **“Vice Chancellor”** means the Vice Chancellor of University of Health Sciences Lahore.

Note: The words and expressions used in this Prospectus, but not defined herein, shall have the same meaning as are assigned to them in the Prospectus.

GENERAL

1. The rules and regulations contained in this prospectus are approved by the Government of Punjab. The prospectus is revised on yearly basis to update the changes.
2. This prospectus has been issued for the Session 2025-2026 and it is applicable to all candidates desirous of admission and those who shall be admitted to public sector Medical/Dental Institutions of the Punjab. All candidates must go through the prospectus before applying for admission. The candidates are required to read, know and abide by the rules and regulations given in the prospectus. Ignorance of rules and regulations shall not be considered as an excuse under any circumstances at any stage.
3. The admission policy contained in the prospectus shall be applicable to following Medical and Dental Institutions (*Note: The following list is in alphabetical order*):

5. The clinical training and education will be imparted to the students in the attached teaching hospital(s).

Central admissions to all public sector Medical and Dental Institutions of Punjab shall be made by the University of Health Sciences, Lahore, as the “Admitting University”, on behalf of the Government of Punjab, in accordance with the Admission Policy notified on 22nd October, 2025. The University is responsible for the conduct of Medical and Dental College Admission Test (MDCAT) in Punjab.
7. There is co-education in all the institutions except in Fatima Jinnah Medical College, Lahore, where only female students are admitted.
8. The Government reserves the right to add or revise any rule(s) in the prospectus at any stage.

ADMITTING UNIVERSITY

University of Health Sciences (UHS) Lahore

Established in 2002, the University of Health Sciences Lahore, most often referred to by its acronym 'UHS', is the largest health sciences educational institution in Pakistan with over 100,000 registered students and more than 150 affiliated institutions. Together, the five faculties offer around 100 programmes of study in Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Allied Health Sciences and Nursing. UHS has been declared the "Admitting University" by the Government of Punjab for conducting MDCAT-2025 and finalizing admissions to MBBS/BDS courses of Public & Private Sector Medical and Dental Institutions/Colleges in Punjab for the Session 2025-2026.



The University regulates and coordinates the activities of medical education, training & research in healthcare throughout the province of Punjab. It is also the provincial admitting university that finalizes admissions to all public sector medical and dental colleges of the province.

University has been ranked in top 800 medical universities of the world in latest Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) World University Rankings 2024 by subject. UHS is the only medical university of Punjab that has been included in the QS world ranking for three consecutive years. It has also been placed at the highest ranking in Higher Education Commission of Pakistan's National University Ranking for 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015 consecutively in the field of medical and health sciences and is among top 10 Higher Education Institutions of Pakistan. With regards to quality assurance procedures, the University has been placed in top "W" category by HEC in 2015.

The University is mainly focusing on higher research degree programmes in Basic Medical Sciences, Allied Health Sciences and Nursing. UHS is research-intensive. Its ethos from its beginning has been to produce highly relevant research that solves real health problems and improve people's quality of life. At present extensive on-campus research is going on in different areas including diseases such as Asthma, Diabetes, Tuberculosis, Typhoid, Infertility, Environmental Pollution, various types of Cancer, Genetic Disorders, Consanguinity, DNA Analysis, Developmental Abnormalities, Metabolic Syndromes, Hepatitis B & C, Liver and Renal Disorders. Recently, the University has played a crucial role in the COVID-19 vaccine trials and reproductive health awareness and training among school going children and adolescents.

The University has introduced modular integrated curriculum across its medical & dental affiliated colleges. The initiative was taken to meet the accreditation standards of World Federation of Medical Education (WFME). This will allow clinical exposure to the students right from their first year in the medical college. Many elements have been introduced in the curriculum like spiral integration, leadership skills, professionalism, clinical clerkships, family health and teaching of Holy Quran. The University has also introduced structured assessment in professional examinations. The University has incorporated six life-saving emergency skills in all medical and dental curricula.

INTRODUCTION OF PUBLIC SECTOR MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS

(In alphabetical order)

Allama Iqbal Medical College Lahore

Allama Iqbal Medical College is widely regarded as one of the best medical institutions of Pakistan. The Government's initiative in the mid-seventies to establish new seats of learning to spur medical education and research in Pakistan led to the establishment of this institution on 2 May 1975 as Lahore Medical College. Prof. Dr. Akhtar Hussain Awan was the first Principal. On 12 August 1975, a batch of three hundred and thirteen students began their first academic day. Two years later, the college was renamed Allama Iqbal Medical College to commemorate the centenary celebrations of the great philosopher.



At that time, it was housed temporarily in a borrowed inadequate building with meagre audiovisual teaching aids at the Post-Graduate Medical Institute. However, in 1980, the final plan for Allama Iqbal Medical College Complex was agreed upon and its foundation stone was laid in March 1980. With a budget of Rupees 670 million the work on the construction of the campus started. The college complex was inaugurated by then President Ghulam Ishaq Khan on 18th May 1989. The work on 1100-bedded Jinnah Hospital started in 1988.

Initially, the Services Hospital was affiliated with AIMC, but later as the college moved to its present campus in 1990, Jinnah Hospital was built as a dedicated teaching hospital. The hospital started functioning in 1994. Allama Iqbal Medical College Complex has a campus of 105 acres (42 ha) on the canal comprising the basic departments, administrative block, library and fountain pavilion, lecture theatre complex and cafeteria. For the purpose of extra- and co-curricular activities, a sports complex including separate gymnasiums for boys and girls, a swimming pool, tennis courts, hockey and cricket grounds, and an auditorium with a seating capacity of 1500 have also been built. D.G. Khan Medical College, Dera Ghazi Khan

Dera Ghazi Khan abbreviated as D. G. Khan, is a city in the Punjab province of Pakistan. It is the 19th largest city in Pakistan by population. It is the headquarters of the Dera Ghazi Khan District and Dera Ghazi Khan Division.

Dera Ghazi Khan is a mid-country city located at the junction of all four provinces of Pakistan i.e., Sindh, Punjab,



Balochistan, and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. It had once been on the list of prospective capitals of Pakistan due to its prime strategic location. It has beautiful and unique landscapes including the river Indus, green fields, the Pachad Desert, and the Sulaiman Mountains.

D. G. Khan Medical College was established in 2010. Initially, the classes were started at Quaid-e-Azam Medical College, Bahawalpur which were shifted to the D. G. Khan in March 2012. The Government of Punjab allocated 522 Kanals of land to construct a regular academic block, hostel buildings and expand the attached 346-bedded DHQ Hospital Dear Ghazi Khan. The DHQ Hospital was renamed as DHQ Teaching Hospital, Dera Ghazi Khan which has once again been renamed as Allama Iqbal Teaching Hospital, Dera Ghazi Khan. Allama Iqbal Teaching Hospital has major medical and surgical specialties including, General Medicine, General Surgery, Paediatrics, Gynaecology, Eye, ENT, Cardiology, Psychiatry, Nephrology, Neurosurgery, Plastic Surgery, Orthopedics, Urology, Paediatric Surgery, Gastroenterology, Oncology, and Dermatology. The current and former students of the College are referred to as Ghazians.

The Institute of Allied Health Sciences (IAHS) was established in 2020 as a part of D. G. Khan Medical College. The institute is currently offering three-degree programs (4 years) i.e., B. Sc. Medical Imaging Technology (MIT), B. Sc. Medical Laboratory Technology (MLT), and B. Sc. Operation Theatre Technology (OTT).

The College of Nursing, Dera Ghazi Khan is also a part of D. G. Khan Medical College. This institute is currently offering a 4-year B. Sc Nursing Degree Program.

Just after independence, a renowned medical professional, Prof. Shujaat Ali with the help and assistance of his other professional colleagues, nurtured the idea of setting up a medical institution for producing female doctors and train them for helping in the healthcare of the women folk of this newly established country. The idea was presented before the Father of the Nation, Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah who very graciously approved the name of this institution to be associated with his sister Mohtarma Fatima Jinnah. The first Principal was Prof. Dr. Shujaat Ali. The college was formally inaugurated by the Prime Minister Khawaja Nazim-ud-Din, on March 31, 1949. It was indeed a great occasion for the nation as the first women medical institution was established in the country.

The College admitted its first batch of 39 students, who graduated in 1953. This number has now increased to 300 students per year. Since then, Fatima Jinnah Medical College has been training female students not only from Pakistan but also from the Muslim World, other friendly countries and the children of Pakistani expatriates.

King Edward Medical College/KEMU Lahore

King Edward Medical University is the historic and most prestigious medical institution in Pakistan. The Crown Rule in India laid the foundation of this paramount national institution in 1860 as Lahore Medical School with Dr. J. B. Scriven as the first Principal. The then newly built Mayo Hospital was attached to the school in 1870. In 1886, the school was upgraded to Lahore Medical College. The first College Day commenced on 5th of November, 1888. It was presided over by Sir Charles Umpherston Aitchison - the Lieutenant Governor of the Punjab.



The Licentiate Diploma initially offered by the School, from 1860-1870 and later by Punjab University College from 1871 onwards, was re-designated as Bachelor degree and resultantly, first MBBS degree was awarded in 1891.

At the turn of the century, the College then, officially affiliated with the Punjab University in 1906, catered for the needs of whole of Northern and Central India and Burma.

The expansion of college building started in 1910, and in December 1911, Lahore Medical College was renamed as King Edward Medical College. There were generous donations from various princely states for the expansion project and hence, the different blocks of the college were named after these states as Patiala Block, Bahawalpur Block, Farid Kot Block and Kapurthala Block. The building of this institution, now proudly called as the Patiala Block, was completed in 1914 and inaugurated in 1915 by Lord Hardinge of Penshurst, Viceroy and Governor General of India (1910-1916).

After independence, Lt. Col. Ilahe Bukhsh became the first Pakistani Principal of the college and he was physician to the founder of Pakistan, Quaid e Azam. Students of this college provided selfless relief and medical services to the nation during all times including migration, epidemics and disasters. In 2006, the college was upgraded to a degree-awarding medical university called King Edward Medical University.

Nawaz Sharif Medical College, Gujrat

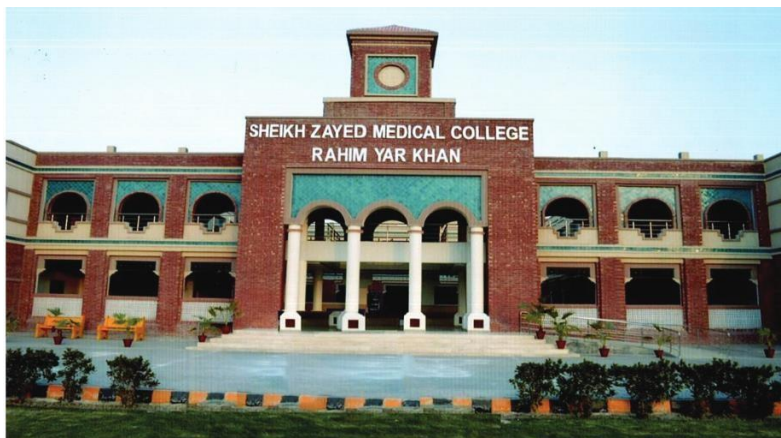

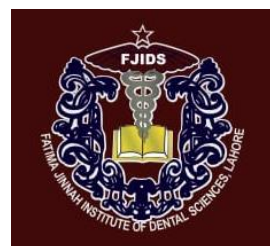

CATEGORIES OF SEATS

i) **Open Merit Seats:**

These seats are open to applicants having valid domicile certificate of any district of Punjab provided they fulfill basic eligibility criteria as stipulated by the PM&DC and laid down in the Prospectus.

ii) **Seats for Students with Disabilities:**

- a) The admission against these seats shall be carried out strictly on merit from amongst the Punjab-domiciled candidates who apply for these seats and who fulfill basic eligibility criteria as laid down in the Prospectus.
- b) The candidate shall have to upload a certificate from a government certified specialist about the nature of his/her disability. Such certificate, however, will only make him/her eligible to apply against the reserved seats.
- c) The students with disabilities shall select the relevant category of seats in the application form and upload the scanned documents including Disability Certificate. The candidate shall be registered for the Medical Board to be conducted by the University. The candidate will be informed telephonically and/or via Email of the date of the Medical Board.
- d) A Medical Board constituted by the Vice Chancellor shall make final decision about the eligibility of the candidate for admission against the reserved seats.
- e) The Medical Board shall consist of experts who will examine the candidate for Physical, Visual or Hearing disability.
- f) Disability for the purpose of admission to medical and dental institutions is defined as *“a physical impairment that has a substantial and permanent adverse effect on candidate’s ability to carry out normal day- to-day activities and puts him/her at disadvantage as compared to a normal person for acquiring education before entering a medical or dental institution. However, the person is, otherwise, capable of completing his/her medical or dental education and performing his/her duties satisfactorily as a medical or dental practitioner later on. Here:*
 - *‘substantial’ means neither minor nor very severe. A person with minor or severe disability is ineligible.*
 - *‘permanent’ means that the effect of the impairment is likely to last for the rest of the person’s life.*

- 'normal day-to-day activities' include mobility, manual dexterity, speech, hearing, seeing, understanding danger, and memory.

g) The Medical Board, according to structured criteria, will judge the threshold of disability. The decision of the Medical Board shall be final in this regard.

- a) The candidate must have a domicile of the same District/Area and he/she must fulfill the basic eligibility criteria as laid down in this Prospectus.
- b) The candidate must have studied, from class one to twelve, from the same district. He/she shall have to upload and submit the School Leaving Certificates/Provisional Certificates issued by the Head Masters/Principals of the concerned institutions where he/she has studied from class one to twelve. Such candidates will also submit a certificate (template given as **Annexure-II**) duly verified by the concerned CEO (District Education Authority) and Director of Education (Colleges), and countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner (DC) of the same district.
- c) Candidates belonging to those tribal areas where there are no high schools or colleges available or the facility for teaching science subjects does not exist, they must have obtained their education from Class-1 to Class-12 from the district in which their respective tribal area falls and have passed their SSC and HSSC examinations from the relevant Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education.
- d) The candidates from these areas can also apply against open merit seats. These reserved seats will be in addition to any number of candidates

being admitted on open merit from these districts. The candidates from each of the above seven districts, admitted or not admitted on open merit, can compete within their districts for reserved seats.

- e) The merit list of candidates of under-developed districts will be displayed on district basis after ascertaining merit from amongst the candidates of the specific district subject to fulfillment of all other requirements and after verification of their documents from the concerned authorities.
- f) Students admitted against these reserved seats from under-developed districts will be required to submit a Surety Bond at their respective college after admission on stamp paper (template given as **Annexure-I**), duly attested for amount of Rs.500, 000/- and with an undertaking that he/she shall serve in his/her district of domicile for at least five years or in default thereof pay Rs. Five Lac in lump sum to the Government of the Punjab.

iv) **Cholistan Seat:**

The Punjab government approved reservation of one (01) seat for MBBS course (w.e.f. Session 2010-11) for **Cholistani students** at Sheikh Zayed Medical College, Rahim Yar Khan, out of its current allocation on open merit basis, with the following criteria:

- a) The candidate must fulfill basic eligibility criteria for admission as laid down in the Prospectus, provided that he/she must have passed HSSC (Pre-Medical Group) examination from any of the districts of Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur or Rahim Yar Khan.
 - b) The candidate must be **Cholistani by birth** and have **actual residence in Cholistan**, as verified by Cholistan Development Authority. He/she shall have to upload a certificate with the application issued by the Cholistan Development Authority (template given as **Annexure-III**).
- v) **Seats for Overseas Pakistanis/Dual Nationality Holders of Pakistani Origin:**
- a) The candidate must fall under the category of “foreign students” as defined in Section 2(g) and Section 4(7) of “Medical and Dental Undergraduate Education (Admissions, Curriculum and Conduct) Regulations 2025”.
 - b) The candidate must hold a permanent foreign nationality or is an Overseas (being a Pakistani citizen permanently resident in foreign country) Pakistani, Green Card Holder, Iqama Holder, Maple Card Holder and who

has studied and passed HSSC 12th grade examination or equivalent from within and outside Pakistan, accompanied by an equivalence certificate issued by IBCC.

- c) The candidate seeking admission on these seats must fulfill the eligibility criteria as stipulated by the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council.
- d) The Overseas Pakistanis if selected against the open merit seats, then they shall pay fee at par with the Pakistani students. However, if they are selected against quota seats reserved for Overseas Pakistanis then they shall deposit fee in foreign currency i.e. 10,000 US Dollars per annum on self-finance basis in accordance with the PMDC Notification PF-1-C-PMDC-Notification/2024/741 dated 21-03-2025. The students admitted under the category shall complete the entire program of study under the same category. An undertaking/ affidavit/ bond shall be provided by the student to this effect

vi) **Seats for Punjab-Domiciled Students in other Provinces/Regions (Reciprocal Basis):**

a) The distribution of these seats is as follows:

- b) The candidate must fulfill the basic eligibility criteria for admissions as laid down in this Prospectus.
- c) These seats shall be filled with Open Merit seats of Punjab.

vii) **ICT / AJK / GB / Ex-FATA / Balochistan and Ex-FATA and Balochistan (HEC Scholarship) Seats:**

- a) For all quotas (excluding reciprocal seats, PTAP and IIOJK), the University of Health Sciences (UHS), Lahore shall accept applications directly from the students/ candidates of ICT, Gilgit-Baltistan, AJ&K, ex-FATA, Balochistan (both categories of ex-FATA and Balochistan seats including the HEC scholarship seats) in accordance with the prescribed criteria for the respective seats and the list of selected candidates shall be

vetted by the respective Provincial Governments/HEC/respective competent forum etc. UHS shall invite applications through public advertisement separately.

- b) The candidates must fulfill the mandatory PM&DC eligibility criteria.
- c) The candidates must have domicile of respective Province/Region.

viii) **Reciprocal Seats for Students of other KPK & Balochistan:**

- a) These seats are reserved for students of KPK & Balochistan. Candidates of Punjab cannot apply on these seats.
- b) Admissions against these seats shall be made through nominations by the respective Provincial Government. Candidates of concerned province shall apply to their respective nominating body which will select candidates on merit as per its own laid down criteria. Direct applications in Punjab shall not be entertained.
- c) The nominating body shall forward the list of candidates selected on merit to the Secretary, Specialized Healthcare and Medical Education Department, Government of the Punjab through their respective Health Department along with their applications and verified copies of documents and certificates. It shall be the responsibility of the nominating body to make sure that the credentials and the documents/certificates of the candidates are correct and complete.
- d) The Specialized Healthcare and Medical Education Department, Punjab, shall forward the applications and documents/certificates of the nominated candidates to the University of Health Sciences Lahore which after initial scrutiny of eligibility of the candidates shall issue letters of admissions to respective medical/dental colleges of Punjab for which the candidates have been nominated. After that, the candidates can join classes in their respective colleges.
- e) Till the final verification of documents/certificates, the admissions of these candidates shall remain provisional.
- f) Candidates must bring their original documents/certificates with them when reporting for admissions in Punjab.
- g) Last date for receipt of nominations in Punjab for the current session is **31st December 2025 for MBBS and 30th January 2026 for BDS seats**. No

nominations shall be accepted after this date.

- h) In case of delayed nominations to the extent of affecting the attendance requirement for the current session, while admission may be considered students would take classes from next academic session.

ix) **Nomination-Based “Over & Above” Foreign Seats:**

- a) These seats are reserved for foreign students to be admitted by the Federal Government in accordance with Section 4(7)(f)(i) of PM&DC Medical and Dental Undergraduate Education (Admissions, Curriculum and Conduct) Policy and Regulations 2025. Types, number and distribution of seats in this category are subject to the approval of the Government of Punjab.
- b) Candidates seeking admission on these seats shall apply as per the procedure advertised by the relevant department/organization of the Federal Government. Direct applications in Punjab shall not be entertained.
- c) The relevant department/organization of the Federal Government shall select the candidates on merit as per its own laid down criteria and send the nominations to the Specialized Healthcare & Medical Education Department, Government of Punjab. It shall be the responsibility of the nominating department/organization to make sure that the credentials and the documents/certificates of the selected candidates are correct and complete.
- d) The Specialized Healthcare & Medical Education Department, Government of Punjab, shall forward the nominations received along with the applications and documents/certificates of the candidates to the University of the Health Sciences Lahore. After the scrutiny of eligibility, the University shall issue letters of admission to the concerned colleges and the candidates can then join their classes.

- e) Till the final verification of documents/certificates, the admissions of these candidates shall remain provisional.
- f) Candidates must bring their original documents/certificates with them when reporting for admissions in Punjab.
- g) Last date for receipt of nominations in Punjab for the current session is **31st December 2025 for MBBS and 30th January 2026 for BDS seats**. No nominations shall be accepted after this date.
- h) In case of delayed nominations to the extent of affecting the attendance requirement for the current session, while admission may be considered students would take classes from next academic session.

BASIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSIONS

It is a mandatory requirement for a candidate who wishes to apply for admission in Punjab to fulfill the following eligibility criteria as a pre-requisite:

i) **Qualification:**

- i. The applicant must have passed, obtaining minimum **60 percent** marks, in Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) Pre-Medical Group or equivalent examination having minimum twelve years of education.

OR

The applicant has passed an examination of a course from a foreign university or examining body or foreign education system, and such course must have been duly certified by the Inter-Boards Coordination Commission (IBCC) as equivalent to Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) or Intermediate level of Pakistan with minimum **60 percent** marks after equivalence.

- ii. It shall be the responsibility of the candidates having foreign qualifications to settle their cases with IBCC and should get equivalence certificate from IBCC for recognition of their qualification and score.
- iii. A candidate shall not be eligible for admission if he/she has not studied and passed the mandatory subjects of Chemistry and Biology and optional subject of either Physics or Mathematics in HSSC or equivalent 12th grade examination recognized in Pakistan. Provided further that expatriate candidates having Intermediate/HSSC/A-Level with mandatory subjects of Chemistry and Biology are eligible for MBBS/BDS admissions on specified seats and the rest as optional subjects.
- vi. For equivalence issues, please contact IBCC Head Office in Islamabad or Regional Offices in Lahore, Karachi, Peshawar, Quetta and Bahawalpur or visit Website: <https://ibcc.edu.pk>

ii) **Domicile:**

- i. Domicile of the candidate is a mandatory document. The candidates having domicile of any district of Punjab are eligible to apply for admission against Open Merit, Under-Developed Districts, Students with Disabilities, Cholistan, and Reciprocal (for Punjab-domiciled candidates in other provinces/regions) categories of seats.

- ii. Overseas Pakistanis/residents with dual nationality do not require a domicile for applying to their quota seats.
- iii. For candidates applying on seats reserved for the students of Under-Developed Districts (Dera Ghazi Khan, Layyah, Rajanpur, Muzaffargarh, Lodhran, Mianwali, and Bhakkar) and Cholistan, it is mandatory to have a domicile of the relevant district. In the case of D.G. Khan and Rajanpur districts, candidates applying for tribal area-specific seats must have "Tribal Area" mentioned on their domiciles. Similarly, for Cholistan seat, candidates must have "Cholistan" mentioned on their domicile certificates.

iii) Medical and Dental College Admission Test (MDCAT):

The candidate must have passed the MDCAT-2023 or 2024 or 2025 examination, achieving a minimum score of 55% for MBBS admissions and 50% for BDS admissions. For foreign candidates and Overseas Pakistanis who completed the HSSC (12th grade) or equivalent qualification abroad and are applying on reserved seats, MDCAT scores, or alternatively SAT-II scores with a minimum of 550 in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics/Mathematics, or foreign MCAT or UCAT (UK) scores with at least 50% in aforementioned subjects, may be submitted.

iv) Age Limit:

There is no minimum or maximum age limit for admission to a medical and dental college.

PROCEDURE AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION

1) Merit Calculation:

- i. The merit for the purpose of admissions shall be calculated as an *Aggregate Percentage* of marks determined by giving the following weightage to obtained marks of the candidate in different exams:

Matriculation/SSC/Equivalent	–	10%
F.Sc./HSSC Pre-Medical / equivalent	–	40%
MDCAT	–	50%
- ii. Merit Calculation Formula is explained in detail with example at the end of the Prospectus (**Annexure-IV**).
- iii. Final calculation in percentage will be rounded up to four decimal points.
- iv. No marks will be deducted for extra attempts availed in HSSC/equivalent examination by the candidate beyond the period two years after passing SSC/ Matriculation annual examination.

2) Admission Procedure:

a. Online Application Process:

- i. The application process shall be completely online and no manual or hard copies shall be entertained. There shall be separate application portals for MBBS and BDS programs. Applicants will be considered as candidates for admission when the Online Application Form has been completed and submitted as per the given procedure alongwith the non-refundable Processing Fee as per the laid down procedure.
- ii. The following steps must be followed to successfully apply for admissions:
 - a) Carefully read the Prospectus and the Admission Policy issued by the Government of Punjab for the 2025-26 session available on the UHS website (www.uhs.edu.pk) thoroughly.
 - b) Access the UHS Online Admission Portal (Separate for MBBS and BDS programs):
For MBBS: <http://public-mbbs.uhs.edu.pk>
For BDS: <http://public-bds.uhs.edu.pk>

- c) Register by providing your Name, Father/Guardian's Name, Email ID, CNIC/Passport/CRC Number, and a Password. *Please note that submitting more than one application by any means (e.g., changing CNIC/Passport Number, Email ID etc.) shall result in disqualification of the candidate.*
- d) Upon logging in, select the seat category/categories for which you are eligible.
- e) Complete the application form with personal details, including name, domicile, contact information, address, nationality, gender, date of birth, etc.
- f) Enter educational qualifications, such as SSC and HSSC marks, year of passing, subjects, etc.
- g) Provide details of MDCAT (or other relevant admission test scores in case of Overseas Pakistani seats).
- h) Choose all colleges in order of preference from the dropdown menu; It is mandatory that **ALL** options must be selected according to the seat category.
- i) Upload scanned copies of required documents, ensuring each file is clear, legible, and does not exceed one MB in size.
- j) Read carefully and acknowledge the Undertaking before submission.
- k) Generate a fee challan of Rs. 2000/- for the non-refundable application processing fee and deposit it at the Bank of Punjab (BOP)/National Bank of Pakistan (NBP) via branch banking or 1BillInvoice(Top-up option may not be used). Upload the paid challan receipt within due date.
- l) Download, print, and review the application before final submission. Submit the online application once all information is confirmed to be accurate. A confirmation will be sent via email.
- m) Modifications to the application may be made before the deadline; no changes are permitted after the application submission deadline.

- iii. It shall be the responsibility of the candidate and the parents/guardians to enter correct information and upload all required documents in prescribed manner in his/her online application failing which his/her application shall be rejected.

b. Order of Preference for Colleges:

- i. When filling out the application, every candidate has to give the Order of Preference for **ALL the medical/dental colleges** on relevant application portal. For this purpose, the candidate will have to select the colleges, one by one, from the drop-down menu. Please note that if the candidate changes the category of seats, the Order of Preference will be reset and the candidate will need to add his/her preferences again. The portal will show the colleges as per the category of seats selected. For example, in case a candidate selects Open Merit on MBBS Portal, it shall be required to select 16 medical colleges for female and 15 medical colleges for a male candidate.
- ii. The Order of Preference is editable till the closing time on the last date of application submission after which it will be locked with the online application. Requests to change order of preference after submission deadline shall not be considered under any circumstances.

c. Mandatory Documents to be uploaded:

1. Domicile Certificate:

The Punjab Domicile is a mandatory document for candidates as explained in detail on Page 45-46.

2. Educational Documents and Their Attestation:

- i. Candidates are required to have the photocopies of their SSC and HSSC (Pre-Medical) result cards attested/verified by the relevant Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education. In case of IBCC Equivalence Certificate already issued, get it attested by the IBCC. These attested documents must be scanned and uploaded on the MBBS/BDS admission portals. For HSSC-pass candidates, attestation by the Inter-Board Coordination Commission (IBCC) is not required at the time of admission. However, after admission to a medical or dental college, candidates will be required to have their educational documents attested by the IBCC upon joining their respective institutions.

- ii. Candidates with foreign educational qualifications (such as A-levels, IB, American/Canadian 12th grade, etc.) must submit an Equivalence Certificate or Provisional Equivalence Letter for the equivalent educational qualification of their 10th and 12th grade examinations, issued and duly attested by IBCC.
- iii. Candidates who have not received equivalence for "Pre-Medical Group" in 12th grade examination from IBCC because they have studied and passed the subject of Mathematics instead of Physics or any other optional subject in their 11/12 grade, must submit the result card issued by the relevant board or university (e.g., Cambridge, American High School) along with their application, proving that they have studied and passed mandatory subjects of Biology and Chemistry in their 11th and/or 12th grades.

3. Identity Documents:

- i. Identity documents include the Computerized National Identity Card (CNIC), National Identity Card for Overseas Pakistanis (NICOP), Pakistan Origin Card (POC), B-Form or Child Registration Certificate (CRC), and Passport. The candidate must submit at least one of the aforementioned documents.
- ii. Along with the application form, the candidate must upload an identity document of one of the parents (Father/Mother) or Guardian.
- iii. Pakistani students residing abroad and holders of dual nationality applying for their reserved seats must upload one of the following documents: **Iqama or Residence Permit or Green Card or Maple Card or Foreign Passport**

Note: *For candidates in Saudi Arabia, a screenshot of the Iqama from the Absher or Ministry of Interior KSA website, showing the permit's expiry date, must be submitted alongside the printed copy of the Iqama.*

- iv. Expired identity documents will not be accepted.

4. Special Documents:

These are the documents required specifically for applying to Quota Seats. They are not necessary for candidates applying solely on open merit.

- i. Candidates applying for reserved seats for Underdeveloped Districts must submit an Education Verification Certificate (a template is available on the UHS website) as proof that the candidate has obtained education from their respective district from the first class to the twelfth class. This certificate must bear the signatures and seals of the heads of all educational institutions (schools and colleges) from which the candidate got his/her education. The verification of this certificate shall be done by the respective Chief Executive Officer (District Education Authority) and Director of Education (Colleges). Additionally, attestation of this document by the Deputy Commissioner of the relevant district is also mandatory.
- ii. In addition to this Education Verification Certificate, these candidates must also upload their School Leaving Certificates/ Character Certificates/Provisional Certificates duly signed and stamped from their respective educational institution.
- iii. Candidates aspiring to apply for Cholistan's reserved seat must upload the Cholistan Development Authority-issued certificate (a template is available on the UHS website) as proof that the candidate is a Cholistani by birth and that his/her current place of residence is in Cholistan.
- iv. Candidates with physical disabilities applying for their reserved seats must submit a Disability Certificate issued by the National Council for Rehabilitation of Disabled Persons (NCRDP), Ministry of Social Welfare, or the Provincial/District Social Welfare Department. Based on this certificate, they shall be presented before a Medical Board to be nominated by the Admitting University, which will assess their eligibility for admission to medical/dental colleges against standard criteria.
- v. Candidates who are students of other provinces/regions shall provide domicile of their particular Province/Region.

5. Photograph, Thumbprint, and Signature:

- i. The candidate must upload a recent photograph along with the admission form. The photograph should not be older than one month. It should be in color, with a white background, and the candidate's face

must be clearly visible. Female candidates are allowed to wear a dupatta or headscarf, but their faces must not be covered. The photograph must not include caps, hats, or sunglasses. Candidates are instructed not to edit/touch-up their photographs.

- ii. The candidate has to sign on white paper with blue ink in running hand and also provide their left thumbprint. The photograph of this document should also be uploaded with the admission form.

6. Important Instructions for Digitizing Documents for Upload:

- i. Applications must be submitted online. Applicants must prepare scanned copies of all required documents in advance.
- ii. Each document must be in JPG/JPEG format, with a maximum file size of 1 MB per document. Applications such as CamScanner may be used for this purpose.
- iii. Only scanned copies of original documents shall be uploaded. Each document must be clear, legible, and free from blurs. Blurred or unclear documents will be rejected.
- iv. For double-sided documents, such as the CNIC, separate files for each side must be uploaded.
- v. Documents should be saved with unique file names and verified for accuracy before uploading.
- vi. If a document is in a language other than English or Urdu, an official notarized or certified English translation duly verified by the Embassy/High Commission of Pakistan in the respective country must also be provided.

PLEASE NOTE!

It is the responsibility of the candidate to upload the right documents in the correct manner. Submission of incorrect documents or failure to upload documents properly shall result in the rejection of the candidate's application without any notice for which the university shall not be responsible. For creating soft files of their documents, candidates may seek assistance from an expert or a trusted person. Furthermore, candidates are warned against uploading any fake or fabricated documents. Otherwise, their applications will be instantly rejected, and legal action may be taken against them.

d. Final Application Submission:

- i. Candidates are advised not to submit their application hastily.
- ii. After completing their online application form, the candidates are advised to take a print-out of their application after clicking “DOWNLOAD” button.
- iii. If any entry is incorrect or any uploaded document is incorrect/unclear/blurred, make the necessary corrections or again upload the document before you make the final submission.
- iv. If a candidate edits his/her application after the submission but before the deadline, only the most recent submission will be considered.
- v. Once you are satisfied that your application is complete in all respects, you can make the final submission by clicking the “SUBMIT” button.
- vi. Take a print-out of your submitted application. You will get a self-generated bank fee challan with this print-out.

e. Display of Provisional and Final Merit List:

- i. After the completion of online application process, the University shall display on its website the Provisional Order of Merit of top 5000 candidates who have successfully applied for admissions keeping in view the number of seats on which admission is to be made.
- ii. The candidates will be given 48 hours after the display of the Merit List to make complaints through Email against any bonafide error, omission, lapse, mistake, fraud or misrepresentation in the list.
- iii. After all necessary corrections/rectifications, Final Merit List will be displayed on the official website of the University. All the selection lists will be based on this Final Merit List.

f. Preparation and Display of Selection Lists:

- i. The University shall prepare college-wise and category-wise Selection Lists of candidates on inter-se-merit basis. There shall be separate lists for MBBS and BDS which shall be issued on University official website as per notified schedule.
- ii. Starting with the first preference, the applicant will be assessed and ranked on his/her merit. According to his/her order of preference, if his/her first choice is taken and filled up by an applicant higher in merit, he/she will be considered for his/her next choice; and if that too is taken,

he/she will be considered for his/her next choice. This will go on until the candidate is placed in a college or all his/her choices are exhausted.

- iii. *The candidates eligible for admission against two or more categories of seats shall be admitted on the seat where he/she is getting a better/higher college as per his/her own order of preference. For example, if a candidate is getting, as per his/her own order of preference, a college listed at number 10 on Open Merit basis, and a college at number 8 on Under-Developed Districts' Seats, his/her admission shall be finalized in the latter category. No application against this decision of the University shall be entertained.*
- iv. Whenever two or more than two candidates are bracketed, i.e., they have exactly the same aggregate percentage after calculation, the tie shall be broken in the following steps (in the same order):
 - The one senior in age will be given preference;
 - The one having higher marks in MDCAT will be given preference;
 - The one having higher marks in HSSC/equivalent 12th grade examination will be given preference;
 - The one having higher marks in SSC/equivalent examination will be given preference, and if the tie still continues,
 - The one who submitted the online application of admission first will be given preference.
- v. Complaint, if any, against the Selection List can be lodged in writing within 48 hours of the display of the list. Any error/lapse in the Selection List will be corrected vide a notification issued by the University to this effect.

g. Joining of Selected Candidates:

- i. It shall be the responsibility of the candidate to check his/her admission status in the selection lists which will be displayed on the University website. The University shall not inform the selected candidates individually.
- ii. Selected candidates will be required to download their college fee challan from the application portal. They will be required to deposit the college fee in the nearest branch of BOP/NBP via branch banking or online through 1Bill Invoice (Top-Up option may not be used) by due

date mentioned on their fee challan. *The candidates will be required to upload the photo of the paid challan or receipt on the portal.*

- iii. To be considered as admitted candidates, individuals must take two crucial steps: (a) deposit the prescribed college fee and other dues by the specified due date and (b) report in writing to their respective colleges by the due date (c) upload the scanned copy of joining report duly signed and stamped by the concerned college on UHS admission portal. Only those who complete these actions will be considered as admitted to the program. Selected candidates shall be given three (03) working days to deposit the prescribed college fee in the BOP after the display of the selection list.
- iv. Those who fail to deposit their college fee, report in writing their joining to their respective college or upload the joining report signed and stamped by the college on UHS portal within due date shall be excluded from the admission/upgradation process and shall have no right of admission/upgradation into the said programme in the current session.
- v. All selected candidates shall have to deposit all original documents at the time of interview in the medical/dental college for which they have been selected along with attested copies of these documents. The signature and thumb impression of the concerned student on the back of attested copies of documents will be taken by concerned college committee (to be constituted by the Principal). The original academic documents etc., will not be returned to the students until:
 - a) he/she has completed his/her MBBS/BDS education (after passing final year professional examination or otherwise);
 - b) he/she has been debarred for further studies due to any reason.
 - c) In case of cancellation of admission/studies due to bogus/fabricated documents, original documents shall not be returned to the candidate and shall only be handed over to police/investigating agency, if required, after taking qualified receipt.
- v. At the time of admission, every medical/dental student shall submit a Surety Bond worth Rs.Three (03) million stating that he/she would serve Government of the Punjab as a “Probationary Medical Officer / Woman

Medical Officer” in the primary healthcare facilities for a period of one year after completing the foundation year/house job. In case, he/she fails to fulfil the commitment, he/she shall be liable to pay Rs. Three (03) million to the Government”. (Health Department Notification No.S.O.(ME)9-4/2015 dated 24th August, 2015).

- vi. The Medical Board of the respective medical colleges may examine selected candidates. If a candidate is disqualified medically, for reasons to be recorded, he/she will not be admitted. The candidate must produce certificates to have been:
 - a) Inoculated against the enteric group of fevers within the preceding 12months;
 - b) Fully vaccinated against Tetanus;
 - c) Fully vaccinated against hepatitis “B” virus;
 - d) Foreign students will have to produce a certificate of their HIV status from prescribed laboratories in Pakistan. If during the course of studies any student is found to be positive for HIV infection, he/she shall be repatriatedat his/her own cost to his/her country of origin.
- vii. The parent(s) or legal guardians should accompany all the candidates at the timeof Joining.

h. Up-gradation Process:

- i. There may be three or more rounds/lists of selection of candidates depending on the availability of vacant seats.
- ii. For second or subsequent list no separate form will be filled by the candidates. The choices of colleges, once entered in the form by the candidate by the submission deadline, shall be final and irrevocable. This final data shall be used inentire selection process for the admission to first year MBBS/BDS for the current academic year.
- iii. The candidate getting selected in previous list will be considered for up-gradation in the subsequent list. The up-gradation herein means shift on merit to a college named higher in the preference order by thecandidate in case of creation of vacancy in that college due to non-joining of earlier selected candidates. The shift in such up-gradation shall be compulsory and mandatory and no exception, whatsoever, will be taken under any circumstances.

- iv. Right of up-gradation shall be given to only those candidates who have joined their prescribed college in the preceding list. A candidate who is selected but does not join the college or cancels the admission shall not be eligible for further selection process/up-gradation.
- v. The candidate shall only be up-graded to a college in case a seat is available and the merit of the candidate corresponds with that of the college.
- vi. Since admissions to the MBBS and BDS programs are conducted separately, the upgradation process shall likewise be specific to each program. Accordingly, a candidate admitted to a dental college shall not be eligible for upgradation to a medical college. However, such a candidate may secure admission to a medical college at a later stage if he has applied for both programs and is found eligible under the relevant merit and admission criteria.
- vii. Requests for mutual transfer or status retention (i.e., stay in the same college even after up-gradation to another college) or down-gradation shall not be permissible under any circumstances.

i. Cancellation of Admission

- i. The admission of the candidate shall be cancelled if he/she fails to deposit the college fee and report in writing at the respective college by the due date.
- ii. The selected candidate who has deposited his/her college fee and wants to cancel the admission should cancel it in writing by submitting an undertaking in this regard on Rs.50/- stamp paper at the University.
- iii. The candidature / admission of the candidate shall be immediately cancelled if any document/information provided by the candidate is found false/fake/fabricated at any stage of MBBS/BDS admissions as well as during the course of studies and legal action may be taken as per Law.
- iv. The admission of the candidate shall be cancelled if it is found at any stage of MBBS/BDS course that the candidate was not eligible for admission according to the admission policy for medical/dental institution of the Punjab.
- v. The admission of the candidate shall be cancelled if the candidate is

found medically unfit at any stage of MBBS/BDS course on the recommendation of the appropriate Medical Board to be constituted by the University on case to case basis.

- vi. A student who is admitted to the first year MBBS/BDS class but is continuously absent from the beginning of the academic session for a period of four weeks without any valid reason shall be struck off from the college roll.

3. Important Admission Rules & Regulations

- i. The Admitting University shall have the power to review and rectify the merit/selection lists in case of any bonafide error, omission, lapse, mistake, fraud or misrepresentation that occurs or is brought to his notice at any stage of admissions.
- ii. Revision of result or improvement of marks by any Board/University after the closing date of submission of application shall not affect the merit list of admissions for the current year in any way. In other words, revised marks certificate shall not be acceptable after the closing date of submission of applications. Similarly, results declared after the closing date of submission of applications shall not be accepted for admission in the current session.
- iii. If considered necessary, the University may call any candidate for interview/investigation/enquiry at his/her own expenses.
- iv. If a candidate already admitted in any medical/dental institution (public or private) of the country, gets admission in Government Medical & Dental Institution of the Punjab, he/she will have to surrender his/her previous admission completely and will not be entitled to any credit of examinations passed as well as dues paid prior to fresh admission.
 - a) He/she must have valid MDCAT qualifying score.
 - b) He/she shall have to disclose his/her previous admission (template given as Annexure-V) at the time he/she reports at his/her college.
 - c) The candidate must not have exhausted all his/her chances to clear a professional examination and should be eligible to carry out further medical/dental education in Pakistan according to University Rules and Regulations.
 - d) Non-disclosure of previous admission shall result in cancellation of admission secured in the current session.
 - e) Under no circumstances a student will be allowed to rejoin the surrendered course.
- v. All admissions shall remain provisional till the closure of admissions for the current session.

Rules & Regulations

1. These rules and regulations shall be applicable to all institutions under the administrative control of the Government of Punjab, Pakistan.
2. The rate of fee given above is for current session only and shall be applicable to all categories of seats.
3. The Punjab-domiciled candidates who will be selected for admission on Reciprocal seats in other Provinces/Regions will have to pay the remaining fee before they join the classes at their respective colleges.
4. **Newly selected candidates must pay their fee within the notified period. Failing to pay dues within the specified date and time, the candidate will lose his/her seat to the next candidate on the waiting list.**
5. A student who defaults in payment of tuition fee shall be liable to be expelled by the college subject to a reasonable period being granted to the student to remedy the defaulted fee.
6. Only those students who are paying college dues will be considered as *bonafide* students of the college.
7. Students taking part in any club or society will pay additional subscription as notified by the institution.
8. If the security deposited is not claimed within six months of leaving the institution, the amount shall be credited to the Students' Welfare/Benevolent Fund, which shall be used to help poor students.
9. Unclaimed scholarships donated by agencies other than government shall be transferred to the Students' Welfare Fund after the expiry of one year period.
10. A detained student shall be charged tuition fee in proportion to the number of failed subjects of that professional examination.
11. The Academic Council of the institution may determine and notify the rates of Students' Welfare Fund, Sports Fund, Magazine Fund and Mosque Fund, etc., according to the local conditions.
12. Those students who avail the college transport will pay monthly charges in accordance with the rates as approved by the Academic Council of the institution from time to time.

13. Remission of Fee:

- a) Remission of fee will be allowed by the Head of the Institution up to 10% of all students belonging to Punjab excluding remanded (including detained or expelled) students (two half fee concessions are equivalent to one full fee remission). Remission of fee means only tuition fee. No other fee or fund will be refunded.
- b) Remanded (including detained and expelled) students will not be entitled for fee concession.
- c) Applications for fee remission must be submitted by the candidates along with a statement stating the financial position of the applicant's parent/guardian and from the head of the department. Fresh applications will be required every year.
- d) The grant of such remission will rest with the Head of the institution and will depend upon the financial condition, general conduct, work and progress of the student. Absence from or failure in professional or house examination, breach of discipline, neglect of studies or irresponsible conduct shall entail the loss of the concession.

14. Refund of Fee:

If a student after having obtained admission seeks to leave the programme, the college shall have the right to adjust the tuition fee already paid *pro rata* to the period spent by the student in the programme along with a penalty not exceeding ten percent of the total annual fee.

NO.SO(ME-II)2-1/2025: Pursuant to the approval of the Government of the Punjab/ Provincial Cabinet in its 29th meeting held on 06.10.2025 the Admission Policy for admissions to the MBBS/BDS Courses for the academic session 2025-26 in public and private sector Medical and Dental Colleges in Punjab is notified hereunder:

1. University of Health Sciences (UHS), Lahore, "Admitting University", shall conduct MDCAT and Central admissions to MBBS/ BDS courses of public and private sector Medical and Dental Institutions/ Colleges in Punjab for the Session 2025-2026.
2. The merit determination formula for the Session 2025-2026 shall be as under:

MDCAT	50% weightage
F.Sc (Pre-Medical)/HSSC/ Equivalent	40% weightage

**Candidates having domicile of Punjab shall appear in the MDCAT of Punjab.*

4. The eligibility criteria for admissions shall be:
 - a. has passed the MDCAT Examination;
 - b. has obtained a Higher Secondary School Certificate (HSSC) qualification or an equivalent 12th grade qualification recognized in Pakistan (IBCC Equivalence Certificate is mandatory in that case) and having obtained minimum 65% marks therein; and
 - c. Has passed the subjects of Biology and Chemistry as mandatory and Physics or Mathematics as optional subjects in the examination of the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination or an equivalent 12th grade qualification recognized in Pakistan.

**Provided that the mandatory requirement of MDCAT shall not apply to the candidates admitted on special program seat pre-defined exclusively for foreign students and on the seats reserved for Overseas (being a Pakistani citizen permanently resident in foreign country) Pakistanis, who have studied and passed HSSC 12 grade examination or equivalent from outside Pakistan. Such students shall qualify SAT-II with minimum score of 550 in each subject or a foreign MCAT examination or UCAT examination with 50% marks in each subject prescribed as stated supra in 4(c).*

5. Hafiz-e-Quran Marks:

The marks for Hifz-e-Quran shall not be granted for admission to Medical and Dental Colleges in the light of PM&DC Medical and Dental Undergraduate Education (Admissions, Curriculum And Conduct) Policy and Regulations 2023 and the decision of six membered Bench vide Order dated 04.04.2023 in Suo-Moto case.

6. Students applying for admissions shall give an order of preferences for public and private sector Medical and Dental Colleges. In case of Private sector, there shall be no

restriction on the number of colleges to be opted by a candidate. In case of public sector, the applicant has to choose all colleges in order of preference. The application shall be editable till the closing date of submission; however; the number and order of preferences cannot be changed after last date of submission of on-line application. A college, not included in the preference list of student, shall not be considered for grant of admission / up-gradation.

7. Students admitted in private sector institutions may exercise the option to forego the right of up-gradation at the time of joining an institution. The option once availed shall attain finality and shall neither be revoked nor modified at any subsequent stage.
8. The admission process shall be conducted through an on-line portal. The University of Health Sciences (UHS), Lahore shall charge a fee of Rs. 2000/- from each candidate applying for admission to public and private sector Medical & Dental Colleges in Punjab. Each candidate shall apply separately to a medical or dental program. A student having not applied to a given program shall not be entitled to admission to such program. The selected candidate shall deposit prescribed college fee within three (03) working days after the display of the merit list. The University shall prepare college-wise selection list(s) in accordance with merit-cum-preference of candidates through a fair digitalized system developed/ acquired by the University. The following procedures shall be followed:

For Public Sector Colleges:

- a. Candidates shall deposit prescribed colleges fee in a dedicated bank account of the University (UHS), Lahore. In case of failure to deposit the prescribed admission fee within stipulated time period, such candidates shall have no vested right of admission in that year.
- b. Only those candidates shall be considered as admitted candidates who will "join" the program by (a) depositing the prescribed fee and other dues by due date, and (b) reporting (in writing) to their respective colleges by due date.
- c. The deposited fee will be disbursed by UHS, Lahore to the concerned colleges immediately after completion of admissions in designated bank accounts of concerned colleges by the UHS, Lahore.
- d. The overseas Pakistanis if selected against the open merit seats, then they shall pay fee at par with the Pakistani students. However, if they are selected against quota seats reserved for overseas Pakistanis then they shall deposit fee in foreign currency i.e. 10,000 US Dollars per annum on self-finance basis in accordance with the PMDC Notification PF-1-C-PMDC-Notification/2024/741 dated 21-03-2025. The students admitted under the category shall complete the entire program of study under the same category. An undertaking/ affidavit/ bond shall be provided by the student to this effect
- e. The students selected against foreign quota seats shall deposit fee in foreign currency i.e. 10,000 US dollars in accordance with the PMDC Notification PF-1-C-PMDC-Notification/2024/741 dated 21-03-2025. The students admitted under the category shall complete the entire program of study under the same category. An undertaking/ affidavit/ bond shall be provided by the student to this effect.

For Private Sector Colleges:

- a. Upon display of name in the merit list, candidate shall deposit Rs.600,000/- (6 lacs only) within three (03) working days after the display of the merit list in the designated account of UHS, Lahore to secure admission seat offered. Failure to deposit Rs.6 lacs/ only within stipulated time (three days after

display of merit list) shall result in withdraw of admission offer and seat shall be offered to the next candidate in merit.

- b. Upon the display of the last merit list the remaining amount of admission fee shall be paid by the candidate directly at his/ her respective medical/ dental college in which he/she shall secure admission. The student shall have the right to pay the tuition fee on a quarterly, six monthly or annual basis to the college in line with the Medical and Dental Undergraduate Education (Admissions, Curriculum and Conduct) Policy and Regulations 2023.
- a. The deposited fee (Rs. 6 lacs only) will be disbursed by UHS, Lahore to the concerned colleges immediately after completion of admissions in designated bank accounts of concerned colleges by the UHS, Lahore.
- c. Candidates shall mark their Joining and give Consent for Up-gradation or Stay on the online portal of UHS. In the online Consent Form, candidates are required to indicate their choice from the following options:
 - i. Retain their allocated seat in the same college
 - OR
 - ii. Opt for up-gradation as per merit and order of preference in the subsequent selection list.

9. The cut-off dates for receipt of nominations from Federal/ Provincial Governments and other Nominating Agencies/ Authorities for respective categories of seats shall be as under:

* In case of delayed nominations to extent of affecting the attendance requirement, while admission may be considered students would take classes from next academic year.

10. For all quotas excluding reciprocal seats, PTAP and IIOJK, the University of Health Sciences (UHS), Lahore shall accept applications directly from the students/ candidates of ICT, Gilgit-Baltistan, AJ&K, ex-FATA, Balochistan (both categories of ex-FATA and Balochistan seats including the HEC scholarship seats) in accordance with the prescribed criteria for the respective seats and the list of selected candidates shall be vetted by the respective Provincial Governments/ HEC/ respective competent forum etc.

11. Display of merit lists:

The admissions to public and private sector Medical & Dental Colleges shall be completed as per PM&DC schedule. The admissions in public and private sector Medical and Dental Colleges shall be completed after display of three or more merit lists by the University. The vacancies in second and subsequent merit lists shall be filled through the process of up-gradation, based on merit-cum-preference.

12. Number of Seats:

A. For public sector Medical and Dental Colleges, the admissions for the session 2025-26 shall be made on the following seats:

- i. In private sector medical and dental colleges, upto 15% of their total annual seats may be reserved for foreign students who fulfill the eligibility as stated supra in 4(c). However, where any seat of foreign quota remains vacant due to unavailability of eligible candidates or otherwise, it shall stand transferred to open merit and the student shall be charged fee and other dues prescribed for open merit seats. An ineligible candidate shall not be admitted against such seats.
- ii. Any increase in the number of seats, whether through the expansion of existing institutions or the establishment of a new medical or dental college, subsequent to the issuance of this Admission Policy, shall not be recognized or considered in the current academic session. Such cases shall be dealt in the next academic session.

13. The criteria for admissions against the quota seats in public sector Medical & Dental Colleges is placed at **Annex-E**. In addition, following criteria shall be applicable:

- a. The candidates should fulfill the mandatory eligibility criteria as given above at Para 4.
- b. For admission against seats reserved for Overseas Pakistanis students shall qualify MDCAT or in lieu of that SAT-II with minimum score of 550 in each subject or a foreign MCAT examination or UCAT examination with 50% marks in the subjects prescribed as stated supra in 4(c).
- c. Students selected against overseas quota and foreign quota seats shall deposit fee in foreign currency i.e. US Dollars (\$ 10,000 USD per annum) in accordance with the PMDC notification PF-1-C-PMDC-Notification/2024/741 dated 21-03-2025. The students admitted under the category shall complete the entire program of study under the same category. An undertaking/bond shall be provided by the student to this effect.

14. Domicile of any district of Punjab is mandatory for admission to the following categories of seats in public sector Medical and Dental Colleges:

- a. Open merit
- b. Reserved seats for:
 - i. Disabled students;
 - ii. Cholistan;
 - iii. Under-Developed District;
 - iv. Reciprocal basis for Punjab candidates in other provinces

15. The vacant seats (seats left after cut off date of admissions as notified by PMDC) may be filled through upgradation. In case of exhausting of the eligible pool of candidates through upgradation, second chance for non-joiners (candidates whose name appeared in any of the merit list but he/she did not secure admission by deposit of fees) may be considered by the Provincial Admission Committee.

16. The Prospectus for Admission to Public sector Medical & Dental Colleges, Session 2025-26 shall be prepared by the University of Health Sciences. Lahore and shall be made available for the applicants on its website, www.uhs.edu.pk.
17. The tentative schedule for commencement of classes of public and private sector Medical & Dental Colleges of Punjab shall be as follows:

18. A Provincial Admission Committee, comprising the Vice Chancellors of all Public sector Medical Universities in Punjab, shall vet the selection list(s) before public display. The Secretary, SHC & ME Department shall be the Chairman of the said Committee.
19. In order to implement the admission policy for MBBS/BDS programs smoothly and to complete admission process in fair, transparent and efficient manner, the SHC&ME Department through Provincial Admission Committee is authorized as under:
- To pass directions and taking decisions for admission process from time to time within the legal and notified parameters.
 - Issuing timelines/cut off dates for different steps of admission process and commencement of classes in accordance with PMDC guidelines/notifications.
 - To adopt and implement notifications, guidelines of PMDC issued from time to time.

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ANNEX-E

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSIONS AGAINST QUOTA SEATS:

1. DISABILITY QUOTA:

- a. The candidate must have fulfilled the mandatory eligibility criteria as stipulated by the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council.
- b. The candidate must have domicile of Punjab.
- c. The candidate shall have to attach a certificate from a government certified specialist about the nature of his/her disability. Such certificate, however, will only make him/her eligible to apply against the reserved seats.
- d. A Medical Board constituted by the Vice Chancellor of the University shall make final decision about the eligibility of the candidate for admission against the reserved seats.
- e. The Medical Board shall consist of experts who will examine the candidate for physical disability, visual disability and hearing disability.
- f. Disability for the purpose of admission to medical and dental institutions is defined as "a physical impairment that has a substantial and permanent adverse effect on candidate's ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities and puts him/her at disadvantage as compared to a normal person for acquiring education before entering a medical or dental institution. However, the person is, otherwise, capable of completing his/her medical or dental education and performing his/her duties satisfactorily as a medical or dental practitioner later on. Here:
 - *'substantial' means neither minor nor severe; a person with minor or severe disability ineligible.*
 - *'permanent' means that the effect of the impairment is likely to last for the rest of the person's life*
 - *'normal day-to-day activities' include mobility, manual dexterity, speech, hearing, seeing, understanding danger, and memory.*
- g. The threshold of disability will be judged by the Medical Board, according to a pre-defined, structured criterion.
- h. The Merit List of disabled candidates shall be finalized on the basis of *inter se* merit.
- i. The decision of the Medical Board shall be final.

2. UNDER-DEVELOPED DISTRICT

- i. The candidate must have fulfilled the mandatory eligibility criteria as stipulated by the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council.
 - ii. The candidate must have a domicile of the same District/ Area.
 - iii. The candidate must have studied, from class one to twelve, from the same district. He/she shall have to submit original certificates from Head Masters/ Principals of the concerned institutions where he/she has studied from class one to twelve. These certificates should be duly verified by the concerned EDO (District Education Authority) and Director of Education (Colleges), and countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner (DC) of the same district.
 - iv. Candidates belonging to those tribal areas where there are no high schools or colleges available for the facility for teaching science subjects does not exist, they must have obtained their education from Class-1 to Class-12 from the district in which their respective tribal area falls and have passed their SSC and HSSC examinations from the relevant Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education.
 - v. The candidates from these areas can also apply against open merit seats. These reserved seats will be in addition to any number of candidates being admitted on open merit from these districts. The candidates from each of the above six districts, admitted or not admitted on open merit, can compete within their districts for reserved seats.
 - vi. The merit list of candidates of under-developed districts will be displayed on district basis after ascertaining merit from amongst the candidates of the specific district subject to fulfillment of all other requirements and after verification of their documents from the concerned authorities.
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- vii. Students admitted against these reserved seats from under-developed districts will be required to submit a Surety Bond at their respective college after admission on stamp paper duly attested for amount of Rs. 500,000/- and with an undertaking that he/she shall serve in his/her district of domicile for at least five years or in default thereof pay Rs. Five Lac in lump sum to the Government of the Punjab.
 - a) In case of Muzafargarh/ Kot addu, students of both districts shall be eligible to compete on these seats. Domicile and educational requirements as stated above shall apply mutatis mutandis.

3. CHOLISTAN SEAT

The Punjab Government approved reservation of one (01) seat for MBBS course (w.e.f. session 2010-11) for Cholistani students at Sheikh Zayed Medical College, Rahim Yar Khan, out of its current allocation on open merit basis with the following criteria:

- The candidate must have fulfilled the mandatory eligibility criteria as stipulated by the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council.
- The candidate has studied and passed HSSC from any of the districts Bahawalnagar, Bahawalpur or Rahim Yar Khan.
- The candidate must be Cholistani by birth and should have actual residence in Cholistan, as verified by Cholistan Development Authority. He/she shall have to provide a certificate with the application issued by the Cholistan Development Authority in this regard as per specimen provided in the Prospectus.

4. ICT/ AJK/GB/EX-FATA/BALUCHISTAN AND EX-FATA AND BALUCHISTAN (HEC SCHOLARSHIP) SEATS:

- For all quotas excluding reciprocal seats, PTAP and IIOJK, the University of Health Sciences (UHS), Lahore shall accept applications directly from the students/ candidates of ICT, Gilgit-Baltistan, AJ&K, ex-FATA, Balochistan (both categories of ex-FATA and Balochistan seats including the HEC scholarship seats) in accordance with the prescribed criteria for the respective seats and the list of selected candidates

shall be vetted by the respective Provincial Governments/ HEC/ respective competent forum etc. UHS shall invite applications through public advertisement.

- b) The candidates must fulfill the mandatory PMDC eligibility criteria.
- c) The candidates must have domicile of respective category.

5. FOREIGN STUDENTS UNDER TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- a) The applicants seeking admission to medical/dental institutions of the Punjab under this category should submit their applications through their own governments/embassies to the Government of Pakistan (Economic Affairs Division, Islamabad) which will make necessary selection and allocation on the basis of Merit, Choice and Availability of seats.
- b) The nominations against these seats, shall be communicated to the Specialized Healthcare and Medical Education Department, Government of the Punjab, by Economic Affairs Division, Islamabad for onwards transmission to the concerned institutions.
- c) Applications submitted directly to the University or to the Government of the Punjab, shall not be entertained.

6. OVERSEAS QUOTA

- a) The candidate must fall under the category of "foreign students" as per PM&DC Regulations.
- b) The candidate must hold a permanent foreign nationality or is an Overseas (being a Pakistani citizen permanently resident in foreign country) Pakistani, and who has studied and passed HSSC 12th grade examination or equivalent from outside Pakistan and is a resident of a foreign country at the time of applying for admission and possess a certificate from the institution last attended to this effect.
- c) The candidate seeking admission on these seats must fulfill the eligibility criteria as stipulated by the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council.

Fourteen (14) students having domicile of Punjab will be admitted in medical colleges in provinces of Balochistan and KPK and the State of Azad Jammu and Kashmir. The candidates who are eligible to apply on open merit seats can also opt for reciprocal seats. The admission shall be carried out on merit like Open Merit Seats.
